In this presentation, Kim will discuss potential ways forward for governments, First Nations, and also individuals in light of an exclusionary history and hundreds of years of struggle by Indigenous peoples for self-governance and reconciliation. Kim's experience and knowledge promise to make this presentation fascinating and unmissable.
